2. LEARNING OUTCOMES

Learning Outcomes

The aims of the course are to provide students with (i) a working knowledge of psychosocial interventions which are utilized when working with severe mental illness, and (ii) a set of practical skills for implementing psychosocial treatment programs. In this course students will develop the knowledge necessary to recognize the most common psychosocial interventions required to improve aspects related to functioning in different behavioral, social, occupational and family integration areas.

On completion of the course, students should be able to:

- have an awareness of the types of psychological difficulties suffered by people experiencing severe mental illnesses, such as schizophrenia spectrum disorders, bipolar depression and depression,
- have and understanding of the approaches used by clinical psychologists to treat severe mental illness and the evidence base for these,
- provide a critical appraisal of the different intervention approaches for people with severe mental illnesses.
